1 This office would like to congratulate all the winners and is pleased to announce the results of the first ever Division H.O.M.E. Reading Report Competition for both the elementary and secondary levels held on November 28, 2016 at Mibang Hotel, Dipolog City.

2. The program H.O.M.E. means **H**olistic **O**pportunities to **M**aterialize the Reading Programs (CARE & SHARE / *ilove2read*) and **E**valuate the learners' HOTS (Higher Order Thinking Skills).. This competition is holistic in the sense that the learners are not only expected to read and comprehend, but they exceeded beyond comprehension. Their *analytical* and *critical thinking* skills were also developed as they read the books released by this office. Of course the *integration* of the 5 macro skills and values was also evident and students' *interaction* with the text was clearly manifested. Generally, the objective of the competition which was to enhance the analytical and critical thinking skills of the learners (elementary and secondary levels) was 100% attained.

3, Our schools need to create a culture of reading. However, building a culture of reading does not mean simply encouraging the learners to read and write. We need to take them beyond being basic readers. We need to engage them in thinking and processing texts at the highest level. Our learners need to become literate "**processors**" of text who are able to use high-level skills to think, evaluate, analyze, synthesize and make interpretation of what they are reading. These skills are necessary to prepare them for the high-tech, fast-paced world of tomorrow.

4. Enclosed are the official results of the competition as well as the write-ups of the contestants (elementary & secondary levels).

5. A total of 29 elementary and 43 secondary contestants had actually participated. For the elementary level, each district is expected to send one representative, so there are 6 districts not represented. These are Manukan II, Tampilisan, ~~Sibuan~~, Siayan, Katipunan I and Liloy I). Of the 46 identified main secondary schools to join, 3 of them did not send any contestant. These are Dohinob NHS, Manawan NHS and Sindangan NHS.

6. The district and school heads of the identified schools who failed to send any contestant are hereby directed to explain in written form to be addressed to the Office of the Schools Division Superintendent why you failed to send your contestants despite the prompt release of the division memorandum and pocket books for your contestants. Your learners missed the opportunity of joining the competition and their exposure to any competition such as this is really worth remembering throughout their lives. It is expected that this may not happen again in the future competitions.
