- In its sincerest intention to increase environmental consciousness and develop among the children and youth the value of environmental (and natural resources) preservation, protection and rehabilitation, this Office will be launching the One Million Trees in 2020 Going Green Brigada 2017 project in coordination with the Provincial Government of Zamboanga del Norte on May 15, 2017.
- 2. The project featured a 4-year tree planting activities which will be conducted in time of the annual National Schools Maintenance Week also known as Brigada Eskwela on May 15-20, 2017. A total of two-hundred fifty thousand (250,000) tree seedlings for fruit, amenity and agroforestry purposes will be distributed, planted and grown in the schools and communities across the province each year.
- 3. Each pupil/student will be assigned to take care and/or grow one or two tree seedlings throughout the school year every year. School Heads are therefore advised to incorporate and/or draft policies in support to this. At the very least, each student must be provided with an opportunity to check on his/her assigned tree seedling/s on a regular basis.
- 4. School heads are expected to coordinate with the Parents-Teachers Association, Supreme Pupil/Student Government and Barangay Council for the site identification. School heads are likewise expected to ensure maximum community support and participation in this endeavor. A division monitoring team will be formed for this purpose.
