

: 1st BATCH OF EMERGENCY SERVICE TRAINING CORPS

- 1. We are pleased to announce that the Zamboanga del Norte - Dipolog - Dapitan City Council Boy Scouts of the Philippines will conduct the 1st Batch of Emergency Service Training Corps (ESTC) two (2) weekend on 3 – 5 and 10 – 12 August 2018 at the BSP Scout Camp, Compra, Liloy, Zamboanga del Norte.
- 2. The Emergency Service Program is the contribution of Scouting to Community defense against the distinctive effects of disaster. The program is auxiliary for the community service component of Service Scouting.
- 3. It may well be noted that action does not happen during emergency only but during the normal times as well. Activities such as traffic services providing manpower on government programs and projects doing community service and information drive, especially on public safety and prevention can keep the Emergency Service Corps (ESC) in active duty any given situation.
- 4. The ZANDIDAP Council and the Department of Education - Zamboanga del Norte Division organize and maintain a corps of Senior Scouts as early responder group to serve the people in time of disasters and civil disturbances. This training is compulsory and exclusively for the Senior Scouts who achieve and working for the Venturer Rank and Eagle Scout Rank only. Attached the list of qualified VS & ES Candidates.
- 5. Hereunder are other pertinent information about the course.
 - Qualification for admission (compulsory to Venturer & Eagle Scout Rank only):
 - Must be currently registered and physically fit as certified by a Physician
 - Holder of Venturer Rank and Eagle Scout Rank Candidates
 - Parent Consent
 - and endorsement of Secondary School Principal
 - Course Fee: Php 1, 000.00 per participant to cover for meals, snacks, ESC patch, Training 5.2 Materials/Supplies and other administrative expenses. The Registration Fee, transportation and other incidental expenses are chargeable against MOOE, local funds or local school board funds or solicited from other agencies subject to auditing rules and regulations.
 - 5.3 What to bring: the Senior Scouts and Outfit Advisors are encouraged to bring the following
 - > Camping tent, rain coat, rope and survival kit
 - Utensils (plate, fork, spoon, bowl)
 - Current BSP membership IDs
 - > Type A and Type B Uniform
 - Notebook and ballpen


