

- 1. With reference to DepEd Memorandum No.66, s. 2018 2018 Brigada Eskwela Implementing Guidelines, this office hereby enjoins all concerned to fully observe the conduct of the 2018 Brigada Eskwela on May 28 to June 2, 2018 with the theme "Pagkakaisa Para sa Handa, Ligtas at Matatag na Paaralan Tungo sa Magandang Kinabukasan." The Brigada Eskwela, also known as National Schools Maintenance Week, is a program that brings together all education stakeholders and provides them opportunity to contribute their time, effort and resources to make our public schools safe, conducive and ready for the opening of classes for School Year 2018-2019.
- 2. In view of this, all school heads are expected to hold a simultaneous kick-off ceremony to launch the *Brigada Eskwela* on May 28, 2018 in their respective schools. In order to increase public awareness and generate maximum participation and support, the school head through the Advocacy and Marketing Committee may conduct extensive awareness campaign and other marketing activities which may include interviews/advertisement with local radio, television and newspaper, posting of campaign banners, showing *Brigada Eskwela* music video, distribution of other campaign materials and roadshows such as Brigada caravan.
- School Heads are likewise expected to lead in the planning activities geared towards making the school ecologically conscious, resilient, clean and conducive to learning.
- 4. As stated in the aforementioned DepEd Memorandum, the annual Search for the Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools in the elementary and secondary levels continues with a little adjustment on the required number of teachers on two (2) of the four categories in the Secondary Level, as follows:

| Categories | Number of Teachers | |

| Small School | 9 and below | 9 and below |
| Medium School | 10 - 29 | 10 - 25 |
| Large School | 30 - 50 | 26 - 50 |
| Mega School | 51 and above | 51 and above |

Detailed criteria for selection of the 2018 Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools are clearly defined in DepEd Memorandum No. 66, s. 2018, for reference.

- 5. In connection with paragraphs 13 and 14 of the same memorandum, this Office thereby enjoins the following five (5) division *Brigada Eskwela* Hall of Fame Awardees to ensure the implementation of innovative and community-led efforts to improve student participation and performance and become the first recipient of the *Brigada Eskwela* Plus Most Sustained School Award, namely:
 - Nabilid Elementary School;
 - b. Don Jose Aguirre Elementary School;
 - c. Tampilisan Central School;
 - d. Gutalac National High School; and
 - e. Polanco National High School.

Complete criteria for selection will be issued in a separate memorandum.

- Key officials in the Division Office (DO) will be monitoring the implementation of Brigada Eskwela in schools.
- Expenses that may be incurred in the implementation of 2018 Brigada Eskwela may be charged against respective MOOE/local funds subject to the usual government accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
